



Covid-19 vaccination: Briefing for stakeholders

As we head into winter, we know that parents are keen for their children to have the Covid-19 vaccine, not only to ensure they are protected against coronavirus, but also to minimise the risk of any further disruption to education.

Since the end of last month, our colleagues at Virgin Care have been visiting schools on a daily basis and, over the coming weeks, these teams of mobile vaccinators will work to ensure all children, including those who are home schooled or in private education, have the opportunity to get protected against Covid-19.

As is the case with any complex vaccination programme, there may be times when planned clinics have to be rearranged due to factors outside any organisation's control, such as staff sickness and classroom isolations following a positive covid test result.

In these cases, sessions will be rearranged as quickly as possible, with plans put in place to ensure that vaccinations can be booked in before the end of November.

While the right to protest is widely accepted, we have a zero tolerance approach towards aggressive, intimidating and disruptive behaviour, and will work with police colleagues to ensure vaccination sites are kept secure.

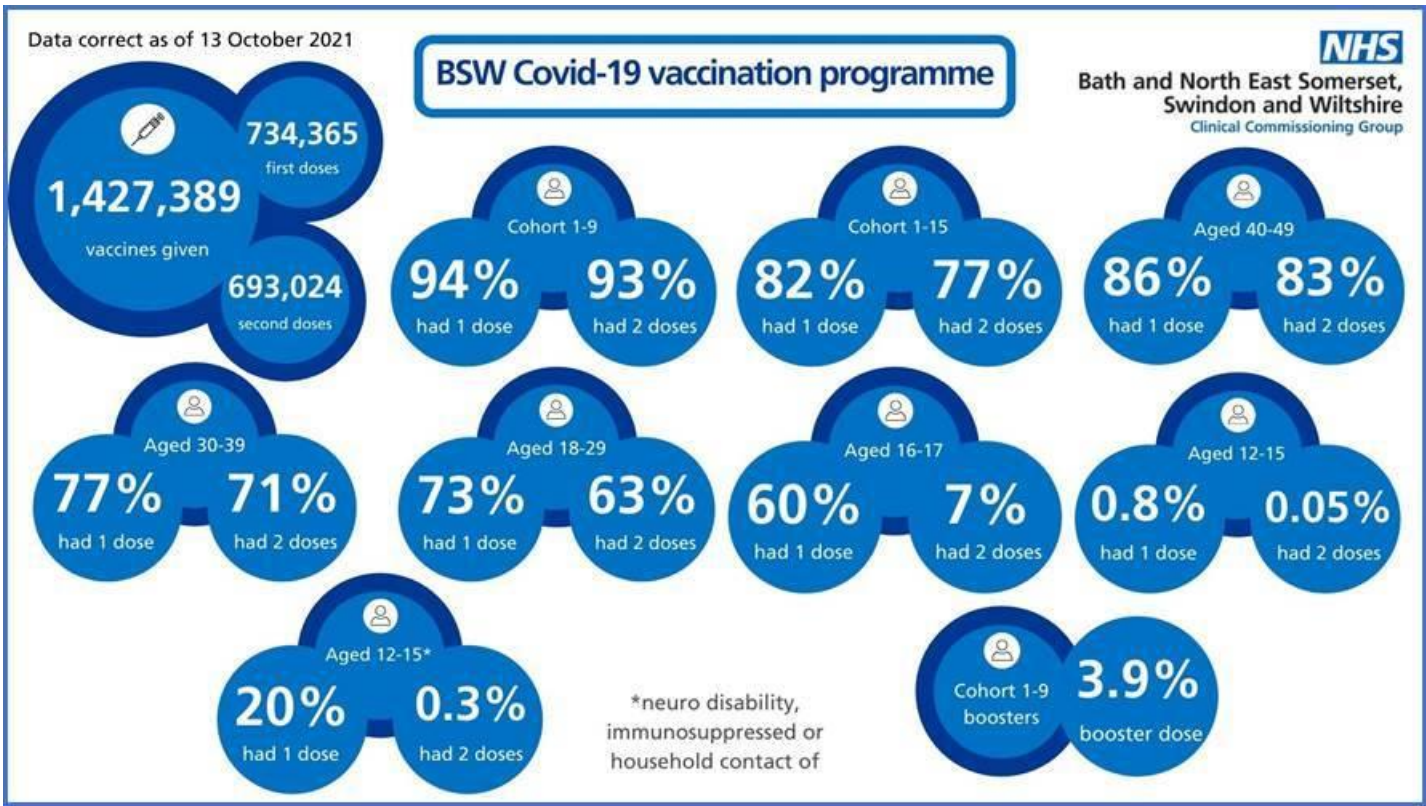
Vaccines still available for people yet to come forward
