Change to UK threat level

The Joint Terrorism Analysis Centre (JTAC) has advised that the UK Threat Level should be changed from **SUBSTANTIAL** (an attack is likely) to **SEVERE** (an attack is highly likely). Further information regarding this change is available at https://www.mi5.gov.uk/threat-levels.

As a consequence of this change in threat levels all NHS organisations are now required to ensure that they have:

- Cascade the change in alert level to your staff
- Review relevant staffing levels and security arrangements across your health facilities, taking account of any additional advice from your local security experts in conjunction with the local police force's <u>Counter Terrorism Security</u> Advisor (CTSA).
- Ensure all staff are aware of your organisation's Incident Response Plans, business continuity arrangements and on call notification processes
- Notify your local NHS England and NHS Improvement Regional EPRR Team of any current or scheduled works or operational changes currently affecting service delivery within your organisation
- Review the Home Office advice issued in relation to this threat, and risk assess this against your own organisation, taking steps where possible to mitigate identified risks
- Review mutual aid agreements with other health services including specialist and private providers
