

## Covid-19 vaccination programme: Stakeholder briefing

“In line with the government’s roadmap to reopening, the majority of coronavirus-related restrictions in England were removed on Monday 19 July.

“While each person will have their own view on the politics of this decision, we in the NHS must stay focused on the vaccination programme, and continue encouraging people to come forward and get protected.

“As mentioned previously, we are now offering vaccines without an appointment, and I’m pleased to say that even more walk-in clinics have opened up in the last seven days.

“The Corn Exchange in Devizes and ABC Drug Store in Downton, near Salisbury, are now also offering the public to walk in to get their vaccine on certain days in our continued endeavour to maximise every opportunity to increase the number of people living in our communities to have the vaccine.

“We have made considerable progress in vaccinating more than two thirds of all people aged between 18 and 29, and we are hopeful that this more-flexible approach will help persuade any person who has yet to receive their vaccine to come forward.

“Of course, our walk-in clinics remain open to people of all ages, so please do continue supporting us in advertising these to as many of our local residents as possible.

“It would also be greatly appreciated if our partners could lend their support in spreading the message that second doses cannot be given out early, and that people hoping to receive their second vaccination less than eight weeks after their first will unfortunately be turned away.”

### At a glance: the latest coronavirus vaccine developments in BSW

- It was announced earlier this week that while there would be no universal vaccine offer to children aged between 12 and 16, there would be a targeted vaccination programme for some children who are more at risk to Covid-19
- It is estimated that a further 184,000 vaccinations are needed across BSW to get us to a point where 80 per cent of people in all age groups have had both doses, and with approximately 191,000 vaccine appointments currently booked in the system between now and September, we remain on course to reach this target

- Vaccines will be given to hospital inpatients throughout September as part of the phase three booster programme that will run during the autumn
- A team of mobile vaccinators will travel across the region next week to provide second doses to care home residents and vulnerable housebound people who have yet to be fully vaccinated
- We are committed to bringing a pop-up vaccination site to the centre of Bath to replace the recent walk-in clinic that had been based inside the Pavilion
- A number of easily accessible city centre venues are being explored for this venture, and we will provide an update as soon as possible
- The previously advertised one-day pop-up clinic at Swindon Town Football Club, which was due to open last weekend, had to be cancelled because of the extremely warm weather
- Like Bath, our teams continue to look for potential venues for another pop-up clinic in Swindon town centre
