• The Central and South Genomic Laboratory Hub: An exciting opportunity has arisen for a Medical Consultant to extend their existing role and become the Cancer Genomic Medical lead for Central and South Genomic Laboratory Hub (C&SGLH). You will be a dynamic, forward thinking consultant who wants to provide a world class Genomics Laboratory service for the population served by C&SGLH.

The laboratories within C&SGLH include:

- Oxford Genetics Laboratories, Oxford University Hospitals NHSFT; which includes the Oxford Regional Genetics Laboratories and the Oxford Molecular Haematology Laboratory
- Wessex Regional Genetics Laboratory, Salisbury NHS FT
- Wessex Molecular Pathology, Laboratory Medicine, University Hospital Southampton NHS FT
- Molecular Pathology Diagnostic Service, University Hospitals of Birmingham NHS FT
- West Midlands Regional Genetics Laboratories, Birmingham Women's and Children's NHS FT The lead contractor for C&SGLH is the West Midlands Regional Genetics Laboratory (WMRGL), based at Birmingham Women's and Children's NHS FT. This sits within the Division of Genetics and works alongside the West Midlands Clinical Genetics Service. The GLH is a member of the Central & South Genomic Medicine Alliance (GMSA) who together deliver the Genomic Medicine Service to the population of the West Midlands, Oxford and Wessex.

You will remain employed by your existing organisation. The role is expected to require 1PA to be included in your Job Plan, for which your employing organisation will be reimbursed. - National Cancer Patient Experience Survey (CPES): For the first time since 2015, the CPES questionnaire has been extensively redesigned with the CPES Advisory Group, to reflect developments in cancer care and treatment, and national policy, including the publication of the NHS Long Term Plan. The questionnaire for 2021 has been reviewed to bring it up to date with current service provision and policy aims, taking account of feedback received from the survey stakeholders. The new questionnaire has been uploaded to the CPES website here. The 2021 CPES fieldwork will begin in late October, with results available next year.
