- **PPG Launch event:** A virtual launch of the Thames Valley Cancer Alliance Patient Partnership Group (TVCA PPG) took place on Tuesday 7th September. - New multi cancer blood test study commences across TVCA: The nation-wide SYMPLIFY study, supported by the National Institute for Health Research, will investigate a new multi-cancer early detection (MCED) test in the NHS, known as Galleri, for patients with non-specific symptoms that may be a result of cancer. The aim of the SYMPLIFY study, which has been facilitated by Thames Valley Cancer Alliance, to open at Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust, Oxford University Hospitals NHS Trust and Royal Berkshire NHS Foundation Trust, is to demonstrate how the Galleri test could be used to increase cancer detection rates and improve diagnostic pathways. - ICS Implementation Guidance: NHSE published further ICS implementation guidance last week, including guidance on clinical and care professional leadership. This guidance document reinforces the important role that Cancer Alliances will continue to play in clinical leadership across their geographies stating that: "ICSs should be careful not to lose the depth and breadth of clinical leadership they currently have. They should build on the expertise of existing clinical and care professional networks; for example, Cancer Alliances and networks covering areas like cardiac, renal and respiratory care. This is not to replace existing networks; it is about aligning them within the ICS".
