- The Exeter University team behind the Electronic Risk Assessment for Cancer (ERICA) trial are looking to recruit 100 additional GP practices to the study. The trial assesses the clinical and cost effectiveness of six electronic risk assessment tools (eRATs) for bladder, kidney, lung, colorectal, ovarian and oesophago-gastric cancers in general practice, with a view to increasing the proportion of early-stage cancers diagnosed.
