ALLIANCE UPDATES

- The TVSCN.nhs.uk website will cease on Monday 7 March 2022 The site hasn't been actively
 maintained since March 2020, but content has remained viewable via bookmarked links and browser
 searches, often accessing out-of-date information. Since June 2021, all current and revised clinical
 protocol information has been made available via the TVCA website (see below) and the SE Clinical
 Delivery and Networks. To reduce the risks of accessing non-current information, the decision has
 been made to remove the TVSCN site. While re-directs have been created to smooth access to
 current documents, please email us if you have any issues accessing the protocols you need.
- Update on chemotherapy regimens on TVCA website Cancer Pharmacist Sally Coutts provides the latest update: The layouts of all but two of the tumour site pages have been updated to incorporate individual chemotherapy regimens. The updated chemotherapy regimens have been uploaded onto the <u>TVCA website</u>. The remaining two tumour sites will be updated later in the year.
- TVCA Urology Cancer Alliance Group From the end of March 2022 Jeremy Crew Consultant Urological Surgeon, Oxford University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, is stepping down from his role as Chair of the <u>TVCA Urology CAG</u>. We would like to thank him for his valuable contribution and leadership to this group and wish him every success in the future. TVCA is currently in the process of recruiting a replacement.
- Cervical cancer screening campaign (14 February to 14 March 2022) This OHID campaign aims to improve knowledge of cervical cancer symptoms and debunk myths around HPV. - 4 February 2022 was World Cancer Day Read the message from Cally Palmer, National Cancer Director NHS England, recognising the hard work of everyone working in cancer services over the last year, and reflecting on some of the highlights. Also read <u>the story of four-year old Teddy Slade</u>, the youngest patient in the UK to be treated using pioneering proton beam therapy. It's a powerful reminder of the compassionate, personalised care colleagues provide across NHS cancer services every day.
- Pioneering new cancer innovations Almost £10 million will be awarded to eight projects for <u>pioneering</u> <u>new technology</u> which is set to benefit thousands of patients across the country. One of the eight projects includes an endoscope-smartphone adapter that can turn a normal iPhone into essential diagnostic equipment for head and neck cancers.
- New life-extending drug for advanced womb cancer A 30-minute treatment, the first of its kind for advanced womb cancer, is being rolled out for women across England. Around 100 women, with advanced and often incurable endometrial cancer, will be offered this life-extending drug.
