## Why is Competence in diabetes nursing important?

Continuous professional development is required as evidence that you are practising safely and is also part of your revalidation process. It is important that you know enough about diabetes to support patients and keep them safe. Working towards competencies helps you to identify what is expected of you and identify any skills gaps you may have. The framework can also be used for career development. Much of the education programme will be based on the TREND (Training and Education for Nurses in Diabetes) competency framework called; "An Integrated Career and Competency Framework for Adult Diabetes Nursing – 6th Edition".

## How can I start using the framework in 2022?

Follow these three easy steps to completing your competency assessment:

### 1. Training

Check the programme and email to book and attend the sessions that are relevant to your role

### 2. Competence

Once you have attended a training session, book an assessment with your practice DNF or DSN (this can be face to face or online). The DSN will chat through what you have learnt during the session and answer any questions you may have.

### 3. Certification

The diabetes administrator will send you a CPD certificate to say that you have met the competency requirements.

## Terms and conditions:

- Backfill payment is available to practice nurses and HCA's working regularly in diabetes (with exception of BANES nurses who have already received backfill payment and completed competency assessment)
- Backfill payment will be paid to practices quarterly
- There is no limit to the number of sessions you can attend and is available for online training and one to one competency assessment
- Backfill available to Practice Nurses and HCAs working in diabetes (except for MERIT)
- Staff are welcome to attend the same session more than once however backfill will only be paid once
- Backfill is available for competency assessment
- Backfill will be paid to the practice, not to the individual
- If the funding stream has reached capacity, we will notify you if backfill no longer available
