

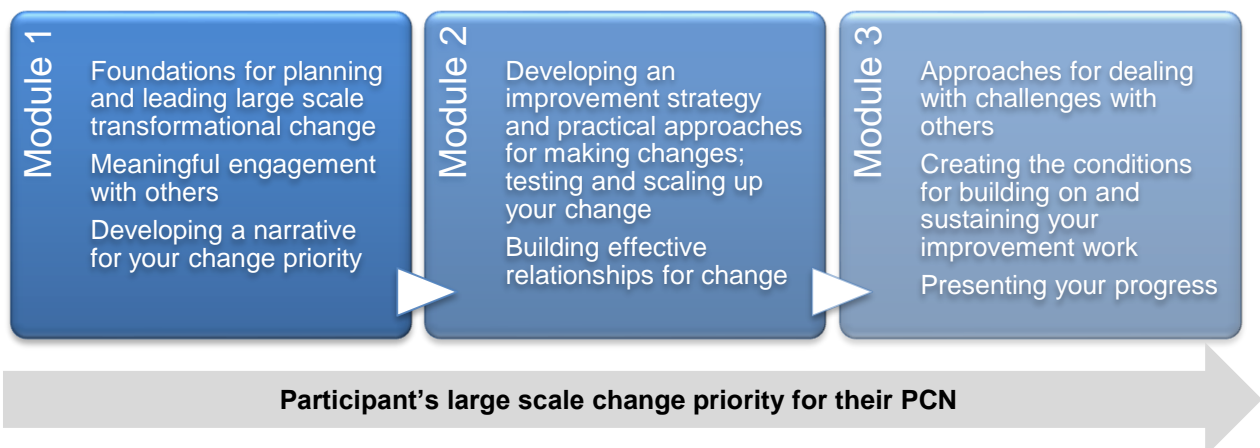
Primary Care Network (PCN) Improvement Leads programme - virtual

The programme is for those with lead roles in PCNs, such as GPs, nurses, practice managers and PCN managers, to help achieve large scale change across their networks. The programme is designed to:

- equip participants with transferable practical improvement skills for working at scale, to help achieve improvement goals in a complex environment
- support participants to understand the key principles for large scale change and how to apply these to their network's challenge, helping create transformational change.

The approach and focus is on PCN-wide challenges and opportunities. Participants must bring an improvement challenge/priority to work on during the programme, for example, optimising the use of new roles across the PCN or improving access to diabetic care for the PCN's hard to reach population. Participants need to commit to attend all modules and provide updates on their progress throughout, including a brief presentation of their progress to date and learning at the final module.

The programme comprises six full days (three two-day modules) with a series of webinars and action learning sets to fully prepare and support participants.



To be considered for a place, applicants must have a large-scale change priority for their PCN that they are able to work on during the programme; an initial outline is required at application.

The pre-programme webinar session includes an introduction to large scale, complex change to help ensure that applicants have priority of appropriate size and scale to benefit from attending the programme. Applicants are then asked to send their finalised priority as the next stage and will be contacted regarding a delegate place. Applicants may be contacted for a conversation with a member of the team and can request a conversation to discuss any queries.

Applicants must have a working knowledge of the Model for Improvement and measurement for improvement, as these are not covered in the programme.
