Why am I being asked to use Teledermatology for lesions?

The upward trend in Dermatology referrals continues and the team are facing challenges in meeting national Dermatology targets including 2WW's.

It is likely that patients referred routinely will have to wait for an appointment for over 20 weeks.

In order for the Great Western Hospital to meet the growing demand, **Dr Lindsay Whittam** (Clinical Lead, Dermatology) and her team are requesting that GPs should send clear photos and history, via the Teledermatology Service in advance of making any lesion or 2WW referral.

This pathway has been trialled for over a year at RUH Bath, leading to a reduction in 2WW referrals of nearly 50%. The process helps to ascertain the number of genuine 2WW referrals into the service after consultant triage, and provide education and feedback on diagnosis and treatment of lesions.

The pathway also ensures patients are cared for in an appropriate setting and are not referred unnecessarily to the hospital.

Who is Teledermatology available to?

The Teledermatology Service is available to all GP practices referring suspected 2WW lesions to the Great Western Hospital and is accessible securely via the **Consultant Connect App** (available free of charge on the Apple Store and Google Play Store).

Please note that:

We welcome all photos, whether or not taken with a dermatoscope, but would request that:

- o They are original photos (not photos of a screen image)
- Lesion photos are taken with a dermatoscope if available, to improve diagnostic accuracy
- A minimum of 3, in-focus, images should be submitted
- GPs can upload photos sent in by patients
- From January 2017 to December 2020, GWH has received 12,350 Dermatology 2WW cancer referrals
- The conversion rate for these patients was 21%.
- Only 1 in 5 Fast Track referrals are diagnosed with cancer.

This new pathway aims to improve the conversion rate, and provide continuous education and feedback to GP colleagues.
