OTHER CANCER UPDATES

Please note; recent updates have been made to The Green Book, a government document that
sets out information on the coronavirus (Covid-19) vaccines, and advice on the dosage and
schedules for the use of the vaccines in the UK. As you'll be aware, the Government announced
on Monday 18, January that the Covid-19 vaccination programme will be extended to people in
JCVI priority group 4. Priority group 4 includes people who are clinically extremely





vulnerable and will include people having active cancer treatment as well as many in follow-up. All other cancer patients such as those treated a long time previously and who were treated surgically will be covered by priority group 6. New updates to The Green Book mean that people who are planned to start or are undergoing chemotherapy or radiotherapy treatments will now be included in priority group 4. These patients can now be recommended for COVID-19 vaccination prior to their treatment where it is deemed clinically safe to do so. People whose level of risk is about to increase – such as those waiting for planned cancer surgery – may also be offered the vaccine alongside the CEV group. TVCA is working with all trusts to support vaccinations being offered on a consistent, equitable basis for all cancer patients as a priority.
