## NEWS FROM THE SE REGION

 Details regarding the national Help Us Help You Lung cancer campaign are still being received. To date, we know that TV adverts and radio messages, will start to be aired from Monday 15, February. However, PR and media packs as well as campaign resource materials, will be shared a little later in the week to avoid clashes with other national messaging, due to go out next week. An email with embargoed information, has been sent to our stakeholders – we ask that you do not start sharing any of this messaging until Wednesday 17, February. Our local TVCA lung cancer messaging and focus on areas where lung cancer incidence is high, will begin from Monday 22, February. If you have any questions relating this campaign or have not received our email with further information, please do contact us. We would also be very grateful if you could share these campaign details with your colleagues and staff across primary and secondary care as it will be important to ensure people responding to this campaign, can get access to the right care at the right time. As the campaign progresses, we will keep you updated and ask that you let us know if you start to experience high levels of demand that need support.

## OTHER CANCER UPDATES



- NICE guidance for NG12 was updated at the end of January 2021, following the amended recommendation on when to offer faecal testing for colorectal cancer. Please see updated guidance on the NICE website.
- We have shared on <u>our Futures workspace</u>, the **COVID-19 Equity of Cancer First Treatment Volumes: Summary of Latest National Results.** The information in the presentation is a brief summary of the findings in the accompanying COVID-19 Cancer Equity Data Pack, available through the link in the presentation. Data from these reports is being used to directly inform central and local activity in the restoration and recovery of cancer services, including targeting messaging in the national Help Us Help You (HUHY) campaign to support people coming forward with symptoms indicative of cancer to their GP.
- My Cancer My Choices offer a variety of complementary therapy treatments such as yoga, reflexology and acupuncture as additional support treatment for cancer patients. Whilst face to face reflexology and massage treatments have presently been paused, in line with government guidelines, they are currently offering an opportunity for patients to have in-person acupuncture treatments and attend a 4-week "Introduction to Mindfulness" online course, as well as an online 6-week Yoga course. Their next Yoga class starts on 25<sup>th</sup> February.
