NEWS FROM THE ALLIANCE

- We continue to work with all TVCA partners to **maintain the priority P1 and P2 cancer** treatments during the current covid peak. Nationally since March and October over 176,000 people started treatment for cancer, 95% of whom did so within 31 days. Within TVCA the secondary care forum are meeting weekly to review and support any mutual aid requests for diagnostics and treatment. A summary of the **TVCA prioritisation process** is attached for further information. We would like to extend thanks to you all for everything that is being done to maintain cancer services through this latest challenging period.
- CRUK are currently advertising for a <u>Health Professional Facilitator for Thames Valley Cancer</u> <u>Alliance</u>. Closing date is Sunday 7, February.
- Our expressions of interest for a **Primary Care Clinical Lead for our Personalised Care programme** are also still open. All details are on the NHS Futures Workspace. Closing date for applications is 5pm on Sunday 24 January.
- East Berkshire CCG are launching a **new service to support cancer patients** from February 1, 2021. This is called the Cancer Support Network and has been established as a community project by Involve to reach out to people affected by cancer in the Bracknell Forest and Wokingham boroughs. - Our primary care clinical lead, Dr Anant Sachdev, has shared some <u>useful cancer information</u> <u>leaflets and resources</u> that Ringmead Medical practice have been sharing with their patients and wanted to extend the offer to other GP Practices to utilise this information. Please be aware that these are given to the patient directly *after* their vaccination, along with their vaccination certificate.
