- Wessex LMC have a series of 6 audio podcasts which appear to be Adult and Child Safeguarding, eg on intrafamilial abuse/county lines/hoarding.

- RCGP has a group learning session, which appears to be free of charge. <u>https://elearning.rcgp.org.uk/course/search.php?search=safeguarding</u> This group learning session is aimed at all members of the practice team, and covers the objectives up to level 3. Core information is delivered through a presentation, which includes interactivity and group discussion. There is one each of these for adult and child safeguarding. Following completion of this 30 minute session, a further 30 minutes of guided self-directed group work is available for download. By completing both of these, and using the guide on reflective practice, all competency criteria for level 3 adult safeguarding can be met. This will enable you to get the most out of the remainder of the minimum eight hours of level 3 learning which is required every three years. This course was funded by the eLearning Department.
