Wessex Rapid Investigation Service - user feedback report

We are delighted to publish the latest feedback report on our Rapid Investigation Service (RIS). This report provides a summary of the first 40

patients and 1 carer who accessed and were discharged from the RIS, along with recommendations for the service to make improvements. We extend our thanks to Wessex Voices, who carried out the patient interviews and wrote this feedback report.

In addition to this report, we have also produced a summary for patients, explaining what changes have been made to the service as a result of their comments. We recognise the value in making sure our services reflect the needs and expectations of the population we serve and we are very grateful for the time people took, to provide their feedback. We intend to continue gathering feedback, however, this will now take the form of an online survey rather than phone interviews. We look forward to sharing the outcome of this in the future.
