Wessex Cancer Alliance updates

- Over the weekend, we heard the news that England will be entering a second lockdown later this week. We wish to reassure our colleagues, partners and voluntary sector support organisations, that we will continue to work with you in the ways we have been doing already this year and we endeavour to keep you updated and share any information we receive, as quickly and clearly as possible. It will come as no surprise to you that our need to continue with cancer services remains a priority as well as keeping our patients safe during this time. If we learnt anything from the last lockdown, it was that clear lines of communication and guidance, are absolutely vital in ensuring our patients continue to receive the high quality care and support they know and expect from us all. If you have any questions or comments about how we communicate with you, or about how this lockdown may impact your staff, colleagues or patients, please send us an email so we can ensure the support from our team, is always where it needs to be.
- We were delighted to hear about the really positive feedback received from a community radio station in Southampton, who have recently supported the Communities against Cancer project by running a series of Cancer Care programmes on their radio station; Awaaz FM. During these shows, they had 35 callers who spoke to them about how their perception of cancer has changed following the transmission of the programmes. Over 500 contacts were made via social media and feedback forms 85% of the people who completed a feedback form, said the programmes were worth listening to and were useful to them.
