# Wessex Cancer Alliance Update Bulletin 25.

## Wessex Cancer Alliance updates

- If you would like to take part in the online **Empowering Engagement Programme**, starting in January 2021; your expression of interest form must be submitted by 3 December 2020. All details about the programme and how to get in touch, are attached.
- The British Medical Journal has published a new paper; Prevalence and predictors of poor sexual well-being over 5 years following treatment for colorectal cancer: results from the ColoREctal Wellbeing (CREW) prospective longitudinal study. Jane Winter, Nursing and AHP Lead for Wessex Cancer Alliance, is one of the authors of this new paper. You can read the paper here.
- With the risk of the COVID-19 pandemic, there is a current drive in the NHS to move services out of hospital, to protect patients from the virus whilst ensuring treatment continuity. Xgeva (denosumab) home (self) administration is therefore now available as an option. Within our Wessex region, delivery of this initiative has now started in Southampton University Hospital and Dorset County Hospital where a number of patients have received training and are now successfully administering their own denosumab injections. Although both hospitals are in the early phases of this new way of working, initial feedback from both staff and patients is positive and both are collecting outcome data to further support this new initiative. Both Southampton and Dorchester have used the available patient education materials that have been produced by Amgen and found these to help in the delivery of training along with their own materials. We are eagerly awaiting the finalisation and approval of a patient education video that has been produced by Southampton SACT team which will be valuable as a tool to help train patients in self administration.
- A new report <u>Personalising care for people with bowel cancer: Key findings from the Colorectal Wellbeing (CREW) study</u> is now available. CREW was funded by Macmillan Cancer Support. The report describes how CREW was conducted and what it has found, providing evidence to support current NHS objectives to provide personalised care.
