Wessex Cancer Alliance updates

- Nationally, it is remarkable to see what has been achieved in maintaining urgent and essential cancer treatment wherever possible - over 1.2 million people were urgently referred between March and October and over 176,000 people started treatment for cancer, 95% of whom did so within 31 days. This determination to maintain cancer treatment has been reflected in local escalations plans and in the responses we are seeing across the country to the current increase in COVID cases. Across Wessex, we have stood up our <u>Wessex Surgical Hubs</u> and we will do everything we can to sustain P1 and P2 surgery through the current peak of this pandemic. We are also actively looking at ways to support and sustain chemotherapy and diagnostics where local services are finding themselves under pressure. Please can we take this opportunity to say a really big thank you for all the work you continue to do to maintain cancer services; our team at Wessex Cancer Alliance would like to offer their support and if you need our help, please contact us so this can be progressed.
- Please find attached, updated guidance on managing the NHS Bowel Cancer Screening
 Programme which references the involvement of ICS and Cancer Alliances on actions to take
 if local services are impacted. The guidance aims to support conversations NHSEI
 commissioners may have with service providers and sets out the expectation that screening
 services must continue as contracted, including continuing actions to support the restoration
 of NHS screening services. Technical guidance to manage invitations and appointments on
 BCSS is included for information but please note that any service change should be raised by
 the provider to NHSEI regional commissioners so that it can be considered and mitigations
 put in place that minimises any disruption to delivery of the screening programmes.
