Wessex Cancer Alliance updates

- The national **Help Us Help You** campaign will be focusing on Lung cancer, with TV adverts starting today and more social media and press to follow later in the week. - The UK Lung Cancer Clinical Expert Group (CEG) and Roy Castle Lung Cancer Foundation have developed guidance on how to differentiate lung cancer from COVID-19. This is in the form of an infographic which also provides suggestions for diagnostic actions and tests which may help a clinician determine an accurate diagnosis.
