National Information

- The 'Help Us Help You' Lung Cancer Symptoms campaign continues this week. Despite lung cancer being the third most common cancer in England, suspected lung cancer referrals remain lower than normal. As of December 2020, referrals had reached 73% of pre-COVID levels, while referrals for all cancers were just over 100%. Please use the campaign toolkit and marketing assets produced by the National team and help support this campaign.
- Today, Public Health England have published a UK-wide report on **children**, **teenagers** and **young** adults cancer—the first in almost a decade. The report shows survival rates are increasing for most cancers in children and young people. A copy of the report is attached.
- The **Samaritans** have shared a link to a new handbook they have published; "<u>Engaging Men</u> <u>earlier: a guide to service design</u>". Designed for anyone commissioning, designing, evaluating or delivering initiatives, services or activities aimed at improving the wellbeing of men.
- Further to our update on January 22, the Government has now extended shielding
 guidance for clinically extremely vulnerable (CEV) people until 31 March 2021. The
 shielding advice remains the same as the guidance already in place for this group: CEV
 people are advised to stay at home unless for exercise or for healthcare appointments
 (including vaccination).
