- Our Alliance Director Sally Rickard and Wessex AHSN's Director of Innovation, Frank Ratcliff; delivered a presentation to just under 300 industry and organisation leaders last week, to offer an introduction to Cancer Alliances, what we do, how our partnership works as an Alliance and AHSN and how we could work with new organisations to deliver innovation for early diagnosis of cancer. This was all part of a "call for innovation" an NHS England and Improvement and SBRI Healthcare initiative that will be launching on Wednesday 17, March and is an opportunity for industries with 'oven-ready' innovative plans, to bid for funding to work in partnership with the NHS to see those plans, become a reality in cancer care, within the next 18 months. Applications are welcomed for innovative, creative and future proof ideas across medical devices, digital health and equipment, behaviour intervention and new models of care. This competition will accelerate future innovation in the healthcare sector, focusing on cancer. The contracts awarded will be for a maximum of 18 months for up to £5million (incl. VAT), subject to justification.
