Wessex Cancer Alliance updates

Dear Colleague,

One year ago today the country entered Covid lockdown, and everyone's world was turned upside down overnight. It feels strangely both like forever ago, and like the blink of an eye, but so much has happened since. Tragically, many lives have been lost and many others profoundly affected by the pandemic and its consequences - the physical, emotional, psychological and financial impact is difficult to measure but easy to sense in those around us.

Those of us working in and with the NHS have seen at first hand (and all too clearly) the impact of this on so many people, but also have witnessed the great power of the NHS to be a force for good in our country. This is, of course, exemplified by the care and dedication of all those who have worked so hard to save lives threatened directly by Covid infection, but also by those who have continued to deliver other NHS services despite the onslaught.

Cancer pathways have been significantly impacted across the country, with clinical teams in primary, secondary and tertiary care really challenged to maintain services - despite this, cancer care in Wessex continues to perform very well indeed.

The most recently available data (January 2021) confirms that Wessex Cancer Alliance has seen the best 62 day waiting time performance of all Alliances across NHS England, with fewest people waiting over 104 days for treatment, and is in addition the best performing Alliance (by some margin) for the 28 day faster diagnostic standard.

For me, this clearly demonstrates how well our teams have pulled together to continue to serve our population so well and is a real testament to all who have played their part in this regard.

Please accept our very grateful thanks for all you have achieved this year, against the odds, and in the best interests of us all. Onwards and upwards!
